

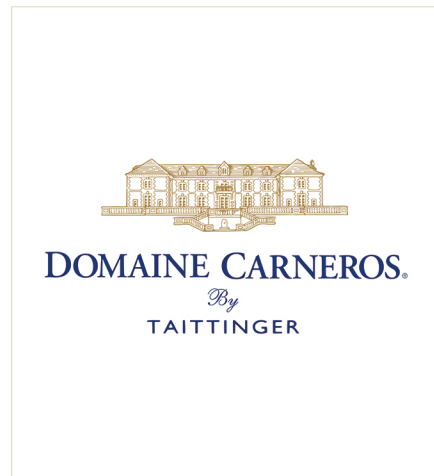
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Celebrate New Year's Eve With The Best Champagnes And Sparkling Wines

Domaine Carneros Le Rêve Rosé, 2016:

Limited quantities of this exquisite California bubbly are available each year. It's a liquid reflection of their finest vineyard parcels (chardonnay and pinot noir). The palate shows heady notes of ripe strawberry laced with orange peel and ginger. It's rich and creamy with finesse and structure and a marvelous mouth-watering edge. Arguably one of the best bubblyies made in California (it's a wickedly close contest with Schramsburg's J. Schram and Roederer's L'Hermitage—try them all, why not? It's a new year.)
