TJ Evans, <u>Pinot Noir</u> winemaker at California's Domaine Carneros, says as recently as seven or eight years ago people would turn down rosé sparkling wine because they'd assume it would be overly fruity. "There's certainly a stigma about sweet," he says.

(Domaine Carneros's Brut Rosé is, as its name suggests, a dry wine. <u>The 2015 vintage has 0.9</u> grams of residual sugar.)
