It's a less expensive alternative to Champagne, it's gaining in popularity with millennial drinkers, sales keep growing, etc. And, today, Prosecco is indeed the world's best-selling sparkling wine by volume — while Champagne brings in a whole lot more revenue.

Bright lemon color. Bright aromatics with peaches, green melon, lemon curd, along with sea salt and white flowers. On the palate this is dry and bright with a salty, lemony approach, along with peaches and green melon. Perfumed, bright, with salted almond, chalky minerals, yet there's a depth to this wine that is really attractive. - IJB
