The New Label: JCB by Jean-Charles Boisset

Chardonnay No. 81, Sonoma County (\$25) shows clean, fresh vanilla notes and soft, palatable fruit. Balanced, lush and ripe, it delivers a long and stylish finish. The **JCB 2008 Chardonnay No. 76, Mendocino Ridge (\$30)** is bright and clean with racy acidity and silky texture ripe and structured with complexity and depth.

The **JCB 2008 Pinot Noir No. 22, Mendocino Ridge (\$100)**, is bright and racy with notes of earth, lovely spice and full-on cherry. The silky smooth **JCB 2007 Pinot Noir No. 7, Sonoma Coast (\$75)** has elegance galore, with racy acidity and precise, tangy cherry fruit. The juicy and—most surprisingly—quite Burgundian graceful style of these wines reflects not only Jean-Charles Boisset's European roots but his commitment to California.
