A Journey From Southborough to California Vineyard

Laura Barrett's long journey to a vineyard in northern California began in her high school chemistry class, with later stops backpacking in Australia and picking grapes in New Zealand.

Along the way, the Southborough native had a brief collegiate fling with tequila, but never abandoned her fascination with the science and art of transforming grapes into sparkling wines.

"I was always interested in chemistry that explains the process of how things are made," said Barrett, who works as winemaker for the 6,000-acre Casey Flat Ranch in the Blue Ridge Range of the Vaca Mountains.

She credits her education at Algonquin Regional High School and, in particular, Advanced Placement chemistry with teacher Lorraine Zanini for "sparking an interest in
