Domaine Carneros: Tasting Le Reve

2018 is the 20th anniversary of Domaine Carneros' first sparkling blancs de blancs, Le Reve ('the dream'), one of California's most expensive tete de cuvées. It's aptly named – creating a great blanc de blancs in the state was the dream of Claude Taittinger of Champagne fame, and so he founded Domaine Carneros in 1987.

What's unique about Domaine



Carneros, though, is continuity: Eileen Crane has been there since the beginning, arriving right after Claude Taittinger bought 56ha in Carneros and founded the brand with the Kobrand Corporation. Crane oversaw everything, from building a winery modeled on the Chateau de la Marquetterie, south of Epernay, to the winemaking. Domaine Carneros now produces eight excellent, vintage-dated sparklers made by the traditional method, but Le Reve has always been the winery's standout. It's fruitier and broader than Taittinger's Champagnes, but the tasting revealed that a thread of understated elegance and delicate sophistication runs through all the vintages

- Crane calls it 'Audrey Hepburn style'. With age, the wines develop a mineral, toasty dimension and exceptionally long finish.



Of the several dozen producers of sparkling wine in California, only a few.... have as much finesse, complexity and longevity as Le Reve.
